We have a full working blog to make announcements and to keep everyone up to date with things that are happening in the company.



PPE UPDATE

July 2017 saw the most audits completed in a month for the whole year- 140, when the next closest was 120 in April. This means an average of 4.5 audits were carried out every day of July.



As well as having the highest amount of audits, July saw the fail rate halve from June.

The quarter has seen 73 of our employees audited almost 300 times, by 12 of our auditors, for a pass rate of 73%.

As you can see from the below chart, the pass rate for PPE audits has steadily risen since our PPE auditing app was launched.



BEST PERFORMERS FOR PPE AUDITS

After reviewing the pass rate for PPE Audits in 2017, we found that 35 of our operative have a 100% pass rate for audits carried out on them. Of these, two stand out; William Horn has been audited 27 times and passed every time, and Freddy March passed all 30 of his too.

This is a great achievement and we wish to congratulate them for their hard work and dedication to their Health & Safety.

TOOLBOX TALKS

This month a Toolbox Talk about Smoking at Work was given by our Compliance & Safety Manager, Jolene Matthews.

THE HEALTH ACT 2006

Since July 2007, smoking has been prohibited by law in the UK in all enclosed or substantially enclosed public places; this smoke-free legislation forms part of the Health Act 2006. Substantially enclosed is defined here as being premises and structures with a ceiling or roof, and where there are permanent openings which total to be less than half of the area of the walls, excluding windows and doors. By this definition, some bus shelters that are enclosed enough must be smoke free. This law also applies to workplace vehicles which are used by more than one person at any time.

SIG'S SMOKING POLICY

As per the Standard Investment Group's Health and Safety Policy, all of our workplaces are smoke-free, and all employees have the right to work in a smoke-free environment. Smoking is prohibited in all workplaces under our control, including company vehicles, plant, and all outdoor work areas that have been segregated to form a working site. All staff are obliged to adhere to and support the implementations of the policy, and appropriate 'No Smoking' signs should be clearly displayed at the entrances to and within the premises, also in every company work vehicle.

QUITTING SMOKING

Don't forget that smoking damages your health and puts you and others at increased risk of many illnesses such as lung cancer and emphysema. If you need help quitting, your GP can enrol you in a 'stop smoking' clinic, or even prescribe you nicotine replacement therapy such as patches and gum, or medication to help you stop.

WEST HENDON PROJECT

The West Hendon HV project is split over two developments, the first being The Hyde for commercial and residential use located on Rookery Way. This project required a dual lay HV installation over approximately 1.1km, through the residential street of Rushgrove Avenue.

Due to there being several other projects within the local area, it was important to minimise the impact on residents by maintaining access to their driveways and preventing obstructions to street parking.

The Hyde installation route was also shared with Barrett London development, which required a dual lay HV installalation. The DNO's required a minimum of 300mm separation. The Barrett London install is approx. 2.4km with 800m of this particular install taking place along Edgware Road, A5, which has required a strict timeframe with TFL with an agreed completion date of September 4th 2017.



Logistics have been key to completing this project on time, which we are pleased to say will be completed on the agreed date, thanks to the hard work and dedication of the excavation and reinstatement teams, alongside the internal support structure provided by CUS.
